Pat J. Daniel, Interim City Secretary read the description or captions of the Items on the Agenda.

Robinson, Michael Kubosh, Letitia Plummer and Sallie Alcorn; Ronald Lewis, City Attorney, Marta Crinejo, Agenda Director present.

At 9:02 a.m. Mayor Turner called the meeting to order and first called for the Invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Turner recognized Council Member Castex-Tatum and she invited Pastor Remus E. Wright (Fountain of Praise) for the Invocation after which she led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Due to health and safety concerns related to COVID-19, this meeting will be conducted virtually via Microsoft Teams, a web-conferencing platform and streamed as usual on the City's website (https://www.houstontx.gov/htv/index.html), Facebook site (https://www.facebook.com/pg/Houst onTelevision/videos/) and the municipal channel on public television. The Council Members will be participating by videoconference in accordance with the provisions of Section 551.127 of the Texas Government Code that have not been suspended by order of the Governor. Public comment will be allowed on Wednesday during the Public Session portion of the meeting via teleconference at (936) 755-1521; Conference ID# 219 601 461# and details for signing up and participating are posted at https://www.houstontx.gov/council/meetingsinfo.html. Public comment will not be allowed outside of the Public Session portion of the meeting.

Mayor Turner stated that he wanted to review some of the procedures for conducting the Virtual Public Session. He is requesting for Council Members to speak slowly and clearly because this will help the City Secretary, the Close Captioner and the General Public. After Roll Call they established there was a Quorum. If by chance for example if they have to leave, just let them know on the Chat screen if they are leaving temporary or if they are leaving completely because otherwise, they will assume that Council Members are present. If they are making the Motion or Seconding a Motion, they will need to state their name and their action clearly so they can have it down for the record. The Agenda Director will be monitoring the Chat and will provide him their names. Please don't use the Chat Room just for chatting. Please mute themselves when they are not speaking and unmute themselves when they are recognized to speak. For the General Public in order to be recognized as a Public Speaker, they have to sign up for the meeting on Tuesday before 3:00 p.m. in the Office of the City Secretary and then they will call the Speakers name in the order that they have signed up. When their name is called press Star 6 to unmute themselves when their name is called. They may only speak when recognized and to please note that if they speak during the meeting and he hasn't recognized them, he will have to mute and/or remove them off the call.

## MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Turner stated he wanted to congratulate each of them on the election last night and to all of the Council Members that stayed up all night for the results given the opportunity and for all indications they have won and given the opportunity to serve for another year. He also wanted to thank everyone for participating and putting themselves out there. He wants to congratulate the Harris County Clerk, Chris Hollins and his team for just running a very smooth and efficient election. Now Chris Hollins is preparing his transition from his position and going back to the private practice and wishes him the very best.

In respect to COVID-19, even after the election to please bear in mind that we're in the midst of the pandemic. Yesterday, the Houston Health Department reported 301 new cases of positives COVID-19 which brings the total of case numbers for the City of Houston to 85,548 and total number of deaths in our City has increased to 1,347 taking this opportunity to be on guard when it relates to this virus. We want the positivity rate to start going back down and not increasing. In order for the increase to go up more it's important to mask up, social distance and all of the things that we have been talking over a month.

Mayor Turner wanted to speak about the opening in Memorial Park on Monday, he was joined with some of the other Council Members, the Astros Owner Jim Crane, Jiles Gibby of the Astros Golf Foundation and many more and it was to kick off the 2020 Houston Open Golf Tournament which will start on November 25<sup>th</sup>.

Council Members commented and questioned Mayor Turner on the Mayor's Report.
