



SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

The Long Point at Blalock Intersection Improvements Project (Oak Tree - Freedonia) will improve access and traffic flow. The project will provide for the reconstruction of Long Point Road in multiple phases. The initial phase will include redesign of the intersections at Antoine, Blalock, Wirt and Bingle.

This eminent domain proceeding involves the acquisition of a permanent easement containing 2,855 square feet (0.0655 acre) of land located at the southeast corner of Long Point and Blalock. The property is located at 9480 Long Point Road and is owned by Tom Linh Vo and Van Thi Hoang. This matter was referred to the Legal Department to commence eminent domain proceedings after the landowners' legal representative rejected the City's final offer to purchase the property.

Prior to the Special Commissioners' Hearing, the parties were able to reconcile their respective monetary differences and arrive at the sum of \$70,000.00, subject to City Council's approval, as the amount of "just compensation" owed to the landowners for the City's taking. The Special Commissioners' Hearing was convened and the parties announced that an agreement had been reached and requested that the Special Commissioners return an agreed Award for said amount. The Legal Department filed Objections to the Award of Special Commissioners to preserve the City's legal and procedural options pending City Council's consideration of this matter.







H-2: U.S. Bank will provide liquidity for the Series H-2 program in the amount of \$100 million, plus interest (\$107.4 million total). The liquidity agreement will have a 3-year term, and the commitment fee will be 40 basis points for the unutilized portion and 60 basis points for the utilized portion, based on the City's current long-term ratings. Barclays, JPMorgan and Loop are recommended as dealers.

The FWG also recommends U.S. Bank National Association as issuing/paying agent, and Andrews Kurth and Francisco D. Medina as co-note counsel, with respect to both new commercial paper programs.

This issue was discussed and reported out favorably at the December 2nd, 2008 Budget and Fiscal Affairs meeting.

City of Houston Annexation Plan 2009 – 2011

Introduction

In the State of Texas, the Local Government Code defines a city's rights and responsibilities regarding properties within its boundaries and the area immediately surrounding its boundaries (called extraterritorial jurisdiction). This Code is where cities are given authority to change their boundaries either by annexation or disannexation.

Houston's extraterritorial jurisdiction (EJT) is essentially a five-mile band around the City's general-purpose boundaries, with the exception of instances when that band intersects another municipality or its ETJ. Within its ETJ, Houston has limited regulatory authority. Two notable examples are the imposition of Chapter 42 of the Code of Ordinances, a chapter relating to the development and subdivision of land, and the City's authority to consent to the creation and expansion of other governmental entities such as municipal utility districts (often referred to as MUDs).

Annexation is the other key authority a city has within its ETJ. Recent sessions of the Legislature have modified and expanded the manner in which Houston may annex property. The different types include:

General Purpose annexation: This type of annexation is the most commonly known. All of Houston's historically significant annexations have occurred in this manner. For general-purpose annexation, a city must meet a strenuous public notification requirement. Upon annexation, all affected property becomes part of the general-purpose boundaries and is effectively subject to all regulations, taxes and services provided by the City. Residents within this property are residents of the City of Houston and have all the rights and responsibilities afforded thereby. Property considered for general-purpose annexation must be included in a City's annexation plan at least three years prior to the annexation. One instance where the three-year requirement is waived is if the property owner requests annexation.

Limited Purpose annexation: This type of annexation, authorized in the 1999 Legislature, may be conducted as part of a Strategic Partnership Agreement (SPA) with a utility district. It carries less stringent public notice requirements. The annexation typically includes commercial property only. Property (ad valorem) taxes are not levied on properties included in this type of annexation, but the City may levy a sales tax on retail sales conducted in the area. Properties annexed as part of a SPA do not carry the three-year requirement.

The SPA identifies which regulations and services, if any, are imposed in the area annexed. It also identifies the amount of sales tax to be levied and how much, if any, will be shared with the district. Finally, the SPA identifies the length of the agreement and the City's options for when and if the City might make the property subject to general-purpose annexation.

The Annexation Plan

For the years 2009–2011, the City of Houston does not propose to annex any territory for general purposes, except that it will consider the annexation of territory if requested by property owners. The City will continue to consider SPAs with utility districts within the City's ETJ.

In the terms of the agreement, TMC agreed to enter into and provide maintenance for bridge enhancements.

<u>DESCRIPTION/SCOPE</u>: The construction of Cambridge Bridge enhancement will include structural gateway columns, a trell system, landscape and irrigation, facade treatment to concrete surfaces, pedestrian railings, and lighting.

LOCATION: The improvements area is located in the Texas Medical Center Area on the Cambridge Bridge over Brays Bayou. The improvements are located in Key Map grids 533 E.





SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

The Luce Bayou Inter-Basin Transfer Project (Luce Bayou Project) allows for the construction of a conveyance system consisting of a combination of diversion canals and pipes to bring approximately 400 million gallons of surface water per day from the Trinity River Basin to the San Jacinto River Basin (Lake Houston). This project has been foreseen since the late 1930s, and has been included in the Texas Water Plan for this region (Region H) since 2001 as the result of State legislation (SB1). In order to provide surface water necessary to meet the surface water conversion regulatory requirements of the Harris-Galveston Coastal Subsidence District and Fort Bend Subsidence District by the year 2020, the Luce Bayou Project must be completed before then. Due to the size and complexity of the Luce Bayou Project, the preliminary engineering design, including land acquisition and permit application, must begin immediately and the construction must be completed by June 2019.

The City of Houston (Houston) and the North Harris County Regional Water Authority, Central Harris County Regional Water Authority, West Harris County Regional Water Authority and North Fort Bend Water Authority (collectively referred hereafter as Water Authorities) have agreed to proceed with the Luce Bayou Project and amended the existing water supply contracts in this First Supplement to establishes the terms and conditions under which the Water Authorities will share the cost of the Luce Bayou Project. The total cost for Luce Bayou project is estimated at \$250 million dollars, which will be financed by a mix of Texas Water Development Board loans and open market bonds with the debt service being paid by Houston and Water Authorities. The project costs will be shared by the participating parties as follows:

City of Houston	69.8%
North Harris County Regional Water Authority	13.7%
Central Harris County Regional Water Authority	0.5%
West Harris County Regional Water Authority	9.5%
North Fort Bend Water Authority	6.5%

The cost sharing is determined based on each entity's projected water demand in 2040. This request has been presented to the Council's Subcommittee on Regional Water Resources on January 15, 2009 and the committee unanimously voted to recommend it to the full Council for consideration.

permitting, construction, and financing of the Luce Bayou Inter-Basin Transfer Project ("Luce Bayou Project"). The City will review and approve preliminary engineering reports, final plans and construction award. Construction will begin by June 2014 and water delivery will begin by June 2019.

The Luce Bayou Project is the construction of a combined canal and pipeline to bring approximately 400

million gallons of surface water per day from the Trinity River Basin to the San Jacinto River Basin (Lake Houston) where the water is most economically used and distributed. The Luce Bayou Project is required to meet the water demands from the First Supplement to the Water Authority Contracts—the North, Central, and West Harris County Regional Water Authorities and the North Fort Bend Water Authority.

The preliminary work authorization requires 24% participation from City certified Minority / Women / Disadvantaged Business / Enterprise ("MWDBE") firms or State certified Historically Underutilized Businesses ("HUB") and at the end of December 2008, participation was approximately 24.5%. The construction contract will similarly require 19% participation.

Funding will be provided by loans from CWA and Texas Water Development Board ("TWDB") for which a combination of cash and debt service payments will be made. This contract is timely to provide CWA authorization to close in early February on a \$28 million loan from the Texas Water Development Board Water Infrastructure Fund Program for Phase I. Initial funding for right-of-acquisition will be financed by a combination of approximately \$10 million from existing CWA funds on hand (Special Project Equity Funds also known as Sale of Existing Assets and Leases ("SEALs") Funds) and \$5,422,375 lump sum payments from the authorities received in two payments in FY09 and FY10. Houston's debt service payments for right-of-way acquisition and Houston and the Authorities debt service payments for the initial phases will not begin until January 2018 approximately the time the Luce Bayou Project is complete and water sales payments are being received from major contract customers. Houston will attempt to arrange debt service payments for future funding to start in a similar time. This agreement serves as the pledge for debt service payments necessary for CWA to obtain the Water Infrastructure Fund loan from the Texas Water Development Board.

Amount and Source of Funding: No Funding Required

<u>PREVIOUS HISTORY:</u> By Ordinance No.2008-722, City Council approved the closings to vehicular traffic of railroad crossings at Canal Street, Delmar Street, Edgewood Street and Manchester Street, and the abandonment of those tracts of land to Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR) the abutting owner. This is in order to secure new grade crossings across UPRR right of Way on Airport Boulevard and on Orem Drive at Almeda Road.

PROJECT NOTICE/JUSTIFICATION: UPRR has asked that ordinance No. 2008-722 be rescinded and passed as two separate ordinances. The Public Works & Engineering Department, (PWE) Traffic & Transportation Division has coordinated with the Union Pacific Railroad Company (UPRR) to close Canal Street and Manchester Street at the railroad grade crossings to vehicular traffic. These closings were deemed necessary in order to comply with a prior agreement with UPRR to close two (2) existing crossings in order to secure a new grade crossing across UPRR right-of-way at Orem Drive at Almeda Road. A companion ordinance to this Ordinance will replace Ordinance No. 2008-772 with respect to the railroad crossings by Delmar Street and Edgewood Street. Federal funding has been identified to help with two of the four roadway closures in the initial ordinance, however to access this funding, the identified roadways need to be separated out from the other roadways. Therefore, PWE is requesting to rescind the original ordinance and approve two new ordinances separating out the roadways.

Signs giving Notice of the Intent to close the crossings were installed at each location on September 21, 2007 for 30 days. The crossings were then closed in October 2007 on a trial basis to measure the potential impacts. Per PWE Traffic Studies, no negative impacts to life safety or mobility were noted. The closures were approved by the Interdepartmental Review Committee.

PWE requests that City Council approve an Ordinance authorizing the closure of these streets. No additional construction will be necessary to complete the closures.

PREVIOUS HISTORY: By Ordinance No.2008-722, City Council approved the closings to vehicular traffic of railroad crossings at Canal Street, Delmar Street, Edgewood Street and Manchester Street, and the abandonment of those tracts of land to Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR) the abutting owner. This is in order to secure new grade crossings across UPRR right of Way on Airport Boulevard and on Orem Drive at Almeda Road.

PROJECT NOTICE/JUSTIFICATION: UPRR has asked that ordinance No. 2008-722 be rescinded and passed as two separate ordinances. The Public Works & Engineering Department, (PWE) Traffic & Transportation Division has coordinated with the Union Pacific Railroad Company (UPRR) to close Delmar Street and Edgewood Street at the railroad grade crossings to vehicular traffic. These closings were deemed necessary in order to comply with a prior agreement with UPRR to close two (2) existing crossings in order to secure a new grade crossing across UPRR right-of-way at Airport Boulevard at Almeda Road. A companion ordinance to this Ordinance will replace Ordinance No. 2008-772 with respect to the railroad crossings by Canal Street and Manchester Street. Federal funding has been identified to help with two of the four roadway closures in the initial ordinance, however to access this funding, the identified roadways need to be separated out from the other roadways. Therefore, PWE is requesting to rescind the original ordinance and approve two new ordinances separating out the roadways.

Signs giving Notice of the Intent to close the crossings were installed at each location on September 21, 2007 for 30 days. The crossings were then closed in October 2007 on a trial basis to measure the potential impacts. Per PWE Traffic Studies, no negative impacts to life safety or mobility were noted. The closures were approved by the Interdepartmental Review Committee.

PWE requests that City Council approve an Ordinance authorizing the closure of these streets. No additional construction will be necessary to complete the closures.

SCOPE OF THIS AGREEMENT:

This Agreement is to allow for coordination of planned infrastructure improvements by the Midtown Redevelopment Authority, and the City of Houston. Midtown Redevelopment Authority will incorporate the design and construction of certain water lines and sewer lines, which the City of Houston desires to improve, as part of their street paving project. This coordination of construction will minimize disruption to area residents and businesses.

The City of Houston will be participating through this interlocal agreement to fund the design and construction of water and sewer lines along McGowen Street from Smith to Hamilton. The Redevelopment Authority is providing all other funding and are constructing streets, storm lines, storm inlets and leads, and streetscape items. The City will assume ownership, maintenance, and repairs upon completion and acceptance of construction.

DESCRIPTION/SCOPE:

The street to be reconstructed and improved is located in the Midtown area from Smith to Hamilton. The City will be participating in waterline work from Smith to Hamilton and wastewater work from Smith to Milam and Crawford to Hamilton.

The total bid amount for construction of this project is \$5,423,242. The City's portion for water and sanitary replacement/upgrades is \$949,873.







SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

The City Purchasing Agent recommends that City Council approve an ordinance awarding a three-year contract, with two one-year options to Water Engineering Technologies, Inc., in an amount not to exceed \$1,519,500.00 for a web-based automated submeter data collection system for the Public Works & Engineering Department. The City Purchasing Agent may terminate this contract at any time upon 30-days written notice to the contractor.

Large water service customers may apply for an evaporation credit against the sanitary sewer portion of their water bills, based on their use of cooling towers and other points of evaporation. Currently, read sheets from the customer's sub-meters, which measure the water coming into and leaving the evaporation points, are faxed to the PWE Utility Customer Service Branch, where they are manually entered into the billing system to calculate the credit. The WET1440 software application system will enable customers to download their water usage and evaporation data directly into the billing system through a web-based portal. This will result in faster application of the credits and allow an audit function to verify the amount, dollar value and reasonableness of the evaporation credits.

The scope of work requires the contractor to provide all supervision, labor, equipment, materials and supplies necessary to customize and implement the WET1440™ software application as required in the City's request for proposal. Additionally, the contractor will provide 24-hour data collection and analysis, daily helpdesk support, report development and phone consultation services on an as-needed basis.

This Request for Proposal (RFP) was advertised in accordance with the requirements of the State of Texas bid laws. Twenty-seven prospective proposers downloaded the solicitation document from SPD's e-bidding website and two proposals were received (UR International, Inc. and Water Engineering Technologies, Inc.). The evaluation committee consisted of Public Works & Engineering Department personnel. The proposals were evaluated based upon the following criteria:

SCOPE OF SUPPLEMENT AND FEES Due to the addition of the Phase I Preliminary Engineering work, additional funds are necessary to supplement the Phase II Final Design, Phase III Construction Phase Services and the related Additional Services. The Basic Service fees for Phase II and III have been negotiated on a lump sum basis. The total Basic Services appropriation is \$233,252.00, which includes \$188,172.00 for Phase II Final Design Services and \$45,080.00 for Phase III Construction Phase Services.







These new patrol vehicles will be used citywide and at the George Bush Intercontinental Airport by Houston Police Department officers for patrol activities and to respond to emergency incidents. The requested appropriations include \$56,784.00 for mobile data terminals, police radios, antennas, and sirens that will be purchased in separate procurements. The patrol vehicles and ancillary equipment that are being purchased from Fund 1800 are included in the adopted FY09 Equipment Acquisition Plan.

This project was advertised in accordance with the requirements of the State of Texas bid laws. Three prospective bidders downloaded the solicitation document from the Strategic Purchasing Division's (SPD) ebidding website and one bid was received. The Strategic Purchasing Division conducted a thorough search for suppliers who could possibly provide the specified patrol vehicles. As a result, a total of seven suppliers were identified and notified of the project. Subsequent to the receipt of the bid, the suppliers were contacted to determine the reason for the limited response to the project. The suppliers advised SPD that they did not have the facilities to provide and install all of the turn-key aftermarket equipment specified for the patrol vehicles. The suppliers further indicated that if a subcontractor was used they would not be competitive.

These new patrol vehicles will meet the EPA's current emission standards for low emission vehicles. They will come with a full three-year/36,000-mile bumper-to-bumper warranty and the life expectancy is four years or 100,000 miles. See Page 2, the Equipment Usage Summary, for vehicle usage and replacement details. Two of the nineteen patrol vehicles are additions to the Houston Police Department's fleet and the remaining



This practice, where prevalent, spoils the neighborhood's appearance, reduces 'curb appeal' and may potentially reduce area property values. In addition, the weight of vehicles parked on dirt or grass over underground infrastructure, including water and sewer lines, is not in the public interest. The proposed amendments to Chapter 28 establish a process by which civic associations or petitioning citizens may apply for a "no parking in yards" designation that would prohibit the parking of vehicles on an unimproved surface in the front yard or side yard of a single family residence within the designated application area. The Planning and Development Department will develop and administer procedures similar to those currently in place to establish minimum lot size and special building line restrictions. Applications may be submitted by a civic club board or by petition of at least 60% of the homeowners within a proposed application area. Applicants/petitioners will be required to provide a map of the requested boundaries, which must encompass at least five block faces, and will be required to post notice signs on private property at their own expense. In addition, applicants must provide notice to all homeowners in the application area by email, newsletter or other publication. Applications and petitions that are approved by the Planning and Development Director and are without protest will require final approval by City Council. Protested applications will be submitted to a hearing official who may either finally deny the application or recommend it for approval by City Council based on the finding of facts at a public hearing. AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 28 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, HOUSTON, TEXAS, RELATING TO THE PARKING OF VEHICLES ON CERTAIN RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES; CONTAINING OTHER PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE FOREGOING SUBJECT; PROVIDING A PENALTY; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE: AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

* * * * *

WHEREAS, the City Council Committee on Regulation, Development and Neighborhood Protection ("Committee") has held one or more meetings to consider a prohibition against the parking of vehicles on any surface that is not improved in the front or side yards of certain single-family residential properties in the city; and

WHEREAS, the Committee has recommended the adoption of restrictions on the parking of vehicles on any surface that is not improved in the front or side yard of certain residential properties in the city to address concerns of public interest, namely:

- 1. Diminution of property values in single-family residential areas where the parking of vehicles in specified areas of residential properties in the city is prevalent;
- 2. The degradation of the aesthetic appearance of single-family residential areas where the parking of vehicles in the front or side yards of residential properties of such is a significant or common practice; and
- 3. Damage to underground infrastructure caused by the weight of vehicles parked over such infrastructure, resulting in loss of water and other conditions contrary to the public interest.

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to enact regulations to address and mitigate the negative effects set forth in the preceding recitals in affected single-family residential areas resulting from the conduct of those who park vehicles on any surface that is not improved in the front or side yards of residential properties in violation of such regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Committee has voted to recommend to the City Council the passage of regulatory provisions designed to address the practices specified in the foregoing recitals to protect the public health, safety and welfare: NOW, THEREFORE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HOUSTON, TEXAS:

Section 1. That the findings contained in the preamble of this Ordinance are determined to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as part of this Ordinance.

Section 2. That Chapter 28 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended by adding a new Article X, to be entitled "Parking of Vehicles on Residential Properties," to read as follows:

"ARTICLE X. PARKING OF VEHICLES ON RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY

Sec. 28-301. Purpose.

The purpose of this article is to regulate the parking of vehicles or equipment on any surface that is not an improved surface in the front or side yard areas of an improved single-family residential lot to prevent damage to underground infrastructure that would be caused by the weight of vehicles parked over such infrastructure and which would also result in unsightly and permanent damage to such areas, thereby having a negative effect on the aesthetics of single-family residential areas affected by such practices and the property values of residences in those affected areas. This article shall not apply to the parking of any vehicle subject to article XIII of chapter 10 of this Code or Chapter 683 of the Texas Transportation Code.

Sec. 28-302. Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Blockface means that portion of a block that abuts a street between two intersecting streets, or between an intersecting street and the termination of the street.

Civic club means an association, whether or not incorporated, that encompasses a residential area and that, by means of action or efforts by such association or its membership, actively seeks to promote or protect the interests of the area as a separate or identifiable neighborhood or community. At a minimum, a civic club shall have or maintain a name related to or identifying its connection to a residential area, a membership list, a slate of officers, whether paid or volunteers, and a means of communicating with owners of residences in the area on issues or matters of interest to that residential area.

Director means the director of the department of planning and development or his designee.

Front yard means an area extending the full width of an improved single family lot between its side property lines, the front property lot line and a line that is an extension of the front line of the residential structure located on a lot, excluding a driveway. The front yard of a corner lot shall be determined by the street address of the residence located on such lot.

Homeowners association has the meaning ascribed in section 47-601 of this Code.

Improved surface means an area, excluding a driveway, the surface of which is comprised of selected materials constructed to a depth sufficient to distribute the weight of a vehicle or equipment over such area to preclude deterioration and deflection of the area due to vehicle or equipment load, adverse weather, or other conditions. Examples of materials with which an improved surface might be constructed include asphalt, concrete, permeable pavement, or other materials approved by the director of the department of public works and engineering or his designee.

Lot means contiguous land under common ownership, as shown on the most recently approved ad valorem tax rolls of the city, that is used or developed as a unit for residential or nonresidential uses, regardless of whether the land consists of a platted lot or a portion of a platted lot or a combination thereof. Two or more platted lots that have been combined in their entireties as a single building site shall not constitute a single lot for purposes of an application or petition filed pursuant to this article.

Park has the meaning ascribed in section 26-2 of this Code.

Owner means the owner of a single-family residential lot in a residential area that seeks the application of this section to such residential area, as such ownership is reflected in the records of the Harris County Appraisal District at the time of the filing of an application or petition as defined in this article.

Residential area means an area in which not less than 60% of the lots are developed and used for single-family residential structures and purposes.

Side yard means an area of an improved single-family lot circumscribed by a line parallel to and extending along the side of a residential structure located on the lot which line is joined at right angles by lines parallel to and that extend along the front and rear lines of the residential structure on the lot to the side property line of the lot, excluding a driveway.

Single-family residential has the meaning ascribed in section 42-1 of this Code.

Vehicle or equipment means and includes any house trailer, mobile home, motor vehicle, truck, passenger motor vehicle, motor home, camper cabin, motorcycle, trailer, boat, farm machinery or similar equipment or any truck with more than two axles or any trailer, mobile home or motor home with a length exceeding twenty feet.

Sec. 28-303. Parking of vehicles prohibited in certain residential areas; application and procedures.

- (a) Application of section. This section shall apply to those residential areas designated by ordinance of the city council in accordance with the procedures outlined in this section.
- (b) Offense. It shall be an offense for any person to park or to cause, suffer or permit the parking of a vehicle or equipment on any surface that is not an improved surface as defined in this article, within any front or side yard of a single-family residence in a residential area subject to this section. It is presumed that the registered owner of the vehicle or equipment is the person who parked, caused, suffered or permitted the vehicle or equipment to be parked in violation of this article.
- (c) Application; petition; who may file. A request to apply this section to a residential area shall be initiated by filing with the director a written application or petition as follows:

- (1) An application authorized by the board and signed by the president of an active homeowners association or civic club that encompasses the residential area described in the application; or
- (2) If a residential area has no homeowners association or civic club, a written petition signed by at least 60% of the owners within the area.
- (d) Application; petition; submittal. Applications and petitions will be accepted by the director only if submitted no later than 5:00 p.m. on either of the first two business days of each month.
- (e) Written application or petition; information required. An application or petition shall contain such information as the director shall require, including the following:
 - (1) A map of the proposed boundaries of the residential area requested to be made subject to this section. If the residential area is defined by a plat or map duly filed of record, a reference to such plat or map shall be sufficient; and
 - (2) If the request is a letter from a homeowners association or civic club, the name, mailing address, telephone number and email address of a person with the homeowners association or civic club or an owner within the area described in item (1) of this subsection who shall be the contact for the request; or
 - (3) If the request is in the form of a petition, the name and mailing address, including street number, street name and zip code, of all signers of the petition, one of whom shall be designated in the petition as the contact for the request. Each signer of a petition, by his or her signature, shall be deemed to have affirmed that such person is an owner within the residential area described therein, and a statement to that effect shall appear on the face of the petition.
- (f) Residential area; size and configuration requirements. The description of a residential area in an application or petition shall include at least five contiguous blockfaces.
- (g) Filing of request; review and action by director. The application or petition referenced in the preceding subsection shall be filed with the director, and upon receipt, the director shall determine whether such

application or petition is complete. An incomplete application or petition shall be returned to the contact person named therein, specifying its deficiencies. Upon being revised to comply with this section, the application or petition may be re-filed with the director at a subsequent filing date.

- (h) *Notice required by applicant.* Within ten days after the filing of a complete application or petition, the party filing such application or petition shall provide notice thereof to all owners by:
 - (1) The posting of signs on private property at such locations and containing such information as the director shall prescribe; and
 - (2) At least one of the following methods:
 - a. An electronic message directed to all owners within the residential area;
 - Inclusion in a newsletter or other similar publication customarily used by the neighborhood association or civic club to disseminate information of interest to all owners within the residential area; or
 - c. Any other writing or publication deemed by the party making the request as the most effective means of providing notice of such filing to all owners within the residential area.
 - (3) All signs required to be posted by this subsection shall remain in place continuously until either:
 - a. The city council passes an ordinance applying this section to the residential area or acts to deny the application or petition; or
 - b. If the application or petition has been referred to a hearing officer as provided in subsection (I) of this section, the hearing officer determines that the application or petition fails to meet the requirements of this section or any criteria prescribed by the director.
 - (4) All costs to prepare, install, maintain and remove the signs required by this subsection shall be borne by the party filing the application or petition required by subsection (c) of this section.

- (i) Notice required by director. Within ten days after the filing of a complete application or petition, the director shall give written notice thereof to all owners within the residential area. A failure by the director to provide the notice required by this subsection, or failure of any owner to receive such notice, does not affect the validity or finality of decisions reached under this article.
- (j) *Protest; deadlines*. An owner may protest an application or petition by timely filing a written protest with the director within 20 days after the date of the director's notice letter.
- (k) Approval by director. The director shall approve an application or petition and refer the matter to the city council for final action upon determining that:
 - (1) The notice provisions of subsection (h) of this section have been fully and timely performed or completed; and
 - (2) No protest of such application or petition was filed within the period specified in subsection (j) of this section.
- (I) Public hearing; hearing officer. Upon the receipt by the director of a timely filed protest to an application or petition, the director shall refer such application or petition to a hearing officer whom he shall appoint to conduct a public hearing to determine whether the application or petition should be recommended to the city council.
- (m) Approval criteria. The hearing officer shall base his determination on an application or petition by applying the evidence presented at the hearing to the following criteria:
 - (1) The application or petition complied with items (1) or (2) of subsection (c) of this section;
 - (2) The evidence presented shows that the residential area described in the application or petition contains at least five contiguous blockfaces; and
 - (3) The curbside parking spaces or areas within the residential subdivision available to owners for the parking of vehicles or equipment are sufficient to accommodate the number of vehicles or equipment typically parked within the area.

If the evidence presented at the hearing demonstrates to the satisfaction of the hearing officer the likelihood that the parking of vehicles

or equipment in the front or side yards of residences in the residential area has caused, or is presently causing, a diminution in the value of the residences in such area, degrades the aesthetic appearance of the neighborhood, or tends to damage underground infrastructures leading to the loss of water or other conditions contrary to the public interest, the hearing officer shall recommend the application or petition favorably to the city council. The hearing officer's determination shall be set forth in writing, copies of which shall be provided to any interested party upon request. In the absence of any such finding, the application or petition shall be denied.

- (n) Public hearing; notice required; final action.
- (1) The public hearing provided in subsection (I) shall not be held until after the notice requirements of subsections (h) and (i) of this section have been satisfied and the time for filing a protest or opposition to an application or petition, as set forth in subsection (j) of this section, has expired.
- (2) Notice of a public hearing shall be provided by the hearing officer at least 15 days prior thereto and shall contain the date, time and location of such hearing. The notice shall be provided to the contact person listed in an application or petition made pursuant to subsection (c) of this section, and to all persons filing a protest to an application or petition within the period set forth in subsection (j) of this section.
- (3) The hearing officer shall take final action on a request referred to him by the director not later than the sixtieth day following the director's receipt of a written request, unless the hearing date is extended pursuant to subsection (o) of this section.
- (o) Action by hearing officer. At the conclusion of the public hearing, the hearing officer shall either:
 - (1) Recommend that the city council pass an ordinance extending the application of this section to the requesting residential area;
 - (2) At his sole discretion, grant one continuance of the public hearing to a date certain in the future to allow for the provision of additional information relating to any issue arising during such hearing; provided, that the continuance shall not extend more than 15 days from the date of the original hearing; or

- (3) Deny the request, which action of the hearing officer shall be final.
- (p) Submission to city council. If the hearing officer makes the recommendation set forth in item (1) of the preceding subsection, the director shall promptly refer the matter to the city council for final action.
- (q) Action by city council. Upon consideration of the recommendation of a hearing officer pursuant to subsection (o) of this section, the city council shall either:
 - (1) Adopt an ordinance extending the application of this section to the requesting residential area; or
 - (2) Deny such recommendation and request, which action shall be final in all respects.

The city secretary shall provide a true and correct copy of any ordinance extending the application of this section to a residential area to the neighborhood protection official and the parking official and shall cause a certified copy of such ordinance to be recorded in the real property records of each county in which the residential area is located.

- (r) Effective date; term of application. An ordinance extending the application of section 28-303 of this Code to a residential area shall be in force as of its effective date and shall terminate 20 years after such effective date, unless earlier terminated by an ordinance adopted by the city council.
- (s) Re-filing of request. In the event of a denial of a request under this article by either a hearing officer or the city council, no further request shall be filed for the same neighborhood or residential area, or portion thereof, within the six months following the date of such denial; provided, however, if new information is submitted to the director indicating a material change in off-street parking practices within the residential area sufficient to warrant the filing of a new application or petition, the director may waive the six month limitation.

Sec. 28-304. Enforcement.

The provisions of this article may be enforced by any law enforcement officer, the neighborhood protection official or the parking official."

Section 3. That, if any provision, section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance, or the application of same to any person or set of circumstances, is for

any reason held to be unconstitutional, void or invalid, the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance or their application to other persons or sets of circumstances shall not be affected thereby, it being the intent of the City Council in adopting this Ordinance that no portion hereof or provision or regulation contained herein shall become inoperative or fail by reason of any unconstitutionality, voidness or invalidity of any other portion hereof, and all provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable for that purpose.

Section 4. That there exists a public emergency requiring that this Ordinance be passed finally on the date of its introduction as requested in writing by the Mayor; therefore, this Ordinance shall be passed finally on such date and shall take effect at 12:01 a.m. on the forty-fifth day next following the date of its passage and approval by the Mayor.
