AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 7 OF ORDINANCE NO. 2012-0694 TO SHORTEN CERTAIN BALLOT LANGUAGE IN CONNECTION WITH A SPECIAL ELECTION ORDERED BY SUCH ORDINANCE TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 6, 2012, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE CITY OF HOUSTON, TEXAS, A PROPOSITION TO UPDATE THE CITY CHARTER; CONTAINING FINDINGS AND OTHER PROVISIONS RELATED TO THE FOREGOING SUBJECT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Houston, Texas (the "City"), with the assistance of the City attorney, identified a number of provisions in the City Charter that are obsolete, outdated, or have been superseded by state and/or federal law; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to begin to bring the City Charter forward into the 21st Century, the City Council desires to present Charter amendments to Houston voters to repeal the identified obsolete and/or superseded Charter provisions; and

WHEREAS, on August 8, 2012, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 2012-0694 calling a special election for Tuesday, November 6, 2012, to be conducted on the City's behalf by Harris, Montgomery, and Fort Bend Counties in conjunction with other elections, to present to the voters of Houston for their consideration the referenced Charter amendments; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to amend Section 7 of said Ordinance No. 2012-0694 to shorten the ballot language for the proposed Charter amendments to assist the election officials of Harris, Montgomery, and Fort Bend Counties in their efforts to conform the ballot language to the limited space available on voting machines and paper ballots; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HOUSTON, TEXAS:

Section 1. That the findings contained in the preamble of this Ordinance are determined to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as a part of this Ordinance.

Section 2. That Section 7 of Ordinance No. 2012-0694, adopted August 8, 2012, shall be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 7. That the City Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to have prepared and provided the ballots for the Election and any other necessary supplies and services not provided for under the terms of the election services contracts to be entered into between the City and Harris, Fort Bend, and Montgomery Counties in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Election Code and other applicable law. On such ballots shall appear a proposition corresponding to the proposed charter amendments set forth above in Section 2 of this Ordinance (the 'Proposition'), with provision on such ballots to vote 'Yes' or 'No' on the proposition as follows:

PROPOSITION NO. 1 CHARTER AMENDMENT PROPOSITION

[Relating to amending the Charter of the City of Houston by repealing (removing) language that is obsolete or has been superseded by state and/or federal law.]

Shall the Charter of the City of Houston be amended by repealing (removing) language that is obsolete or has been superseded by other law: Article I, Section 2-a, annexation of territory; Article I, Section 2-b, extension of city boundaries; Article II, Sections 14 and 14a, operation of the Houston Independent School District; Article II, Section 16, paragraph 10, regulation of the price of goods; Article II, Section 16, paragraph 15, which authorizes unequal treatment of the disabled; and Article IX, Section 10, exemption of city employees from jury duty?"

Section 3. That if any portion or portions of the Proposition are determined, found or held to be violative of any provision of any state or federal constitution, statute, law, code or regulation, then it is the intention of the City Council that the remainder of such Proposition, if sufficient for the intended purpose and in accordance with applicable law, shall be severable from the portion deemed, found or held to be violative of any applicable law.

Section 4. That if any provision, section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance, or the application of same to any person or set of circumstances, is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, void, invalid, or unenforceable, neither the remaining portions of this Ordinance nor their application to other persons or sets of circumstances shall be affected thereby, it being the intent of the City Council in adopting this Ordinance that no portion hereof or provision or regulation contained herein shall become inoperative or fail by reason of any unconstitutionality, voidness, invalidity or unenforceability of any other portion hereof, and all provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable for that purpose.

Section 5. That the City Council officially finds, determines, recites and declares that a sufficient written notice of the date, hour, place and subject of this meeting of the City Council was posted at a place convenient to the public at the City Hall Annex of the City for the time required by law preceding this meeting, as required by the Open Meetings Law, Chapter 551, Texas Government Code; and that this meeting has been open to the public as required by law at all times during which this Ordinance and the subject matter thereof has been discussed, considered and formally

acted upon. The City Council further ratifies, approves and confirms such written notice and the contents and posting thereof.

Section 6. That there exists a public emergency requiring this Ordinance be passed finally on the date of its introduction as requested in writing by the Mayor; therefore, this Ordinance shall be passed finally on such date and shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; however, in the event that the Mayor fails to sign this Ordinance within five days after its passage and adoption, it shall take effect in accordance with Article VI, Section 6, Houston City Charter.

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

BACKGROUND: The Water Research Foundation is a member-supported, international nonprofit 501(c)3 organization. Formed in 1966, they are the nation's only research foundation devoted to drinking water research and governed by water utilities.

PURPOSES: The City of Houston, along with other member utilities, asks the Water Research Foundation to solicit research proposals on identifying the best available technology, such as granular activated carbon, membrane technology, ion exchange and alternate disinfectants for the removal of contaminants which have been identified as candidates for regulation or which are being proposed for regulation. The foundation also adopts research projects that deal with the study of new technologies which could help treatment plants operate more efficiently and economically or for research which could evaluate the risks and/or cost benefits associated with regulating certain contaminants.

The program is international in scope and the results will benefit all water utilities, including the City of Houston and its customers. The primary benefit that they offer to the City of Houston, and to all utility subscribers, is participation in a centralized research program that is directed by and conducted on behalf of the drinking water community.

As a result of the program, the drinking water community has realized savings of millions of dollars annually; The Foundation has demonstrated the value of an industry-sponsored research program that benefits the drinking water community and the customer.

BENEFITS: As a member of the Water Research Foundation, the City of Houston will receive research on today's most complex challenges. With the long list of proposed regulations now facing the water industry in the short term, this membership will continue to play a vital role in ensuring that the City of Houston is ready to meet these regulations in an efficient and timely manner.





On March 20, 2012, the Department's Drinking Water Operations Branch (DWOB) began experiencing chlorine feed problems at the East Water Purification Plant (EWPP). Initially, a minor leakage of chlorine gas was found along the exterior piping. Upon further inspection, it was determined that the chlorine distribution system gas lines, including all associated instrumentation, valves and fittings, that feed chlorine gas from 1 and 3-ton chlorine cylinders and the 90-ton chlorine rail car offloading station were in immediate need of replacement. The fatigued chlorine piping system gas lines greatly increased the risk of poisonous chlorine gas being released into the air, posing an immediate health and safety risk to the public and City employees. A chlorine feed failure would also completely halt daily EWPP operations, lowering potable drinking water pressure and distribution city-wide, which would be out of compliance with Federal and State Regulations. The Strategic Purchasing Division issued an emergency purchase order on March 21, 2012 to Moody Bros., Inc. to address the emergency.

The scope of work required the contractor to provide all labor, materials, equipment, permits, insurance, bonds, supervision and transportation necessary to immediately mobilize and secure the worksites prior to removing and replacing the liquid gaseous chlorine piping. The contractor's responsibilities included, but were not limited to replacing the chlorine delivery systems' 1" carbon steel gas lines, pressure switches, gauges, transmitters, hose assemblies, fittings, isolation valves and expansion chambers. The contractor also pressure tested the chlorine delivery systems to Chlorine Institute standards.

This recommendation is made pursuant to Chapter 252, Section 252.022 (a) (2) of the Texas Local Government Code for exempted procurements.

The utilization of the MICPA allows the City to leverage existing U.S. governmental contracts with over 38,000 participating agencies with an estimated purchasing power of \$1.5 billion annually. Moreover, the City will receive the most favored nation rate.

The City is eligible to participate in the U.S. Communities Purchasing Alliance as set out in Section 791.011 of the Government Code and such purchases satisfy State bid laws as set out in Section 791.025 of the Government Code.

Hire Houston First

This procurement is exempt from the City's Hire Houston First Ordinance. Bids/proposals were not solicited because the department is utilizing a Cooperative Purchasing Agreement for this purchase.







The Director of the Administration & Regulatory Affairs Department recommends that City Council approve an amending ordinance to increase the maximum contract amount between the City of Houston and T2 Systems, Inc. from \$1,514,850.05 to \$1,893,562.56 for the parking citation management information system (PCMIS) for the Administration & Regulatory Affairs Department (ARA). The ARA Director may terminate this contract any time upon 30-days written notice.

The contract was awarded on June 24, 2009 by Ordinance No. 2009-592 for a five-year term, with two one-year options in the original amount of \$1,514,850.05. Expenditures as of August 15, 2012 totaled \$1,492,751.60. The increase to the maximum contract amount is necessary to allow the contractor to implement additional functionality enhancements to the PCMIS. The additional features will automate several accounts receivable collection processes which are currently performed manually by Parking Management Division (PMD) staff. The PCMIS enhancements shall include: interactive voice response (IVR) and pay-by-citizens' mailing addresses and improve notice submittals; automatically generate and send cited citizens reminder notices; and performs automated updates for all citations. Implementation of the features described above will improve both PMD's cash collection cycle and employee productivity.

The scope of work requires the contractor to provide all supervision, labor, tools, software and supplies to implement the system. The contractor will integrate the parking citation issuance, processing, adjudication and permitting functions, and the associated on-street parking activities, including electronic documentation of meter maintenance into a unified, comprehensive and cost-effective user-oriented system. The Utility District Review Committee has evaluated the application with respect to wastewater collection and treatment, potable water distribution, storm water conveyance, and other public services.

The district is located in the vicinity of Cinco Ranch Boulevard, FM 1463, Roesner Road, and Katy-Gaston Road. The district desires to add 54.5980 acres, thus yielding a total of 638.3688 acres. The district is served by the Fort Bend County Municipal Utility District No. 57 Wastewater Treatment Plant. The other district served by this plant is Fort Bend County Municipal Utility District No. 156. The nearest major drainage facility for Fort Bend County Municipal Utility District No. 57 is Little Prong Creek which flows into Buffalo Bayou and finally into the Houston Ship Channel.



The Administration & Regulatory Affairs Department (ARA) recommends that Council authorize an ordinance approving the change of control of Cequel III Communications I, LLC dba Suddenink Communications, a Delaware limited liability company ("Cequel III") and under the control of Cequel Communications Holdings, LLC ("Cequel Holdings"), that holds the right, privilege and franchise to own, operate and maintain a cable television system within the City of Houston, pursuant to City of Houston, Texas Ordinance No. 2003-621 approving the assignment of the franchise granted by City of Houston, Texas Ordinance 98-15 as amended by City of Houston, Texas Ordinance No. 2002-458 (the "Franchise").

Cequel III has operated its cable system in Houston since 2002. The company pays the City approximately \$800,000 annually in cable franchise fees, as well as fees in support of Public, Educational and Governmental programming, and serves residential customers primarily in the Kingwood area.

Pursuant to the terms of the Franchise, the company is required to obtain the approval of the City prior to any change in control or assignment. Cequel III is the holder of the Franchise and has notified the City that it anticipates a change in control of Cequel Holdings by sale of all the equity interests of Cequel Holdings to Nespresso Acquisition Corporation.

The Administration & Regulatory Affairs Department (ARA) recommends that Council authorize an ordinance approving the change of control of Cequel III that holds the right, privilege and franchise to own, operate and maintain a cable television system within the City of Houston, pursuant to City of Houston, Texas Ordinance No. 2003-621.
