BALLOT BY MAIL (BBM)



RETURN BBM BY MAIL

Ballots mailed within the U.S. must be:

- Postmarked by 7 PM on November 5 (Election Day) AND
- Received by the Elections Department by 5 PM on November 6

RETURN BBM IN PERSON

On Election Day <u>ONLY</u>, voters can deliver their mail ballot in person.

- Location: 1001 Preston St, Houston, TX 77002
- Elections Department staff will set up a tent for drop-off
- Time: 7 AM 7 PM

Requirements to Return Mail Ballot In Person:

- · Voters may only drop off their own mail ballot
- Voters must present one of the 7 acceptable photo IDs upon drop-off




