
In 2023, 205 Texans were victims of intimate partner or stalking homicide. Harris County ranks #1!



## Korean BBQ Meatballs Every baby shower buffet has served

"Baby Shower Meatballs." Use this recipe below and make sure you are always a hit.

Ingredients: 3 lbs Ground Beef 1 Whole Yellow Onion (diced) 2 cups Parmesan Cheese 1 cup of bread crumbs 2 whole eggs 2 garlic cloves (minced) 1 cup of parsley (chopped) pinch of salt and pepper pinch of chili powder pinch of paprika Sauce:

1 cup of Soy

1-1/2 cups of brown sugar 1 cup of orange marmalade 1/2 cup of oyster sauce 1/4 cup of Siracha

Green Onion (chopped) White Sesame Seeds

STEP 1: In a large bowl, combine ground beef, cheese, bread crumbs, onion, garlic, eggs, parsley and seasoning.

STEP 2: Mix all ingredents until perfectly combined.

STEP 3: Form 1 oz meat balls and place on a parchment lined cookie sheet.

STEP 4: In a medium bowl, add all the sauce ingredients and whisk until fully combined.

STEP 5: Bake Meatballs at 375 degrees for 15 minutes.

STEP 6: Remove Meatballs from oven. Using a basting brush, Glaze each individual meatball with the Sauce Mix.

STEP 7: Set oven to Broil High. Broil meatballs for 3 minutes. Remove from oven and let Cool.
