Single-use plastics, like bottles and bags, cause long-term environmental harm, contribute to greenhouse gas emissions, and pollute ecosystems despite short-term use. To lead by example, Houston City Council will cut plastic use in meetings, launching the effort on April 29th with a proclamation and community support. Council Members will receive reusable bags and cups and use a water dispenser instead of plastic bottles.

- Cut single-use plastics in Council operations by 50% in 100 days.

- Switch to metal or reusable straws to reduce plastic waste.
