On August 14, 2014, an open RFP was issued for proposals from eligible home repair agencies to assist households that (1) do not meet the guidelines of either the standard Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Single Family Home Repair Program or the CDBG Disaster Recovery Program, or (2) have exceeded HCDD's capacity limitations. Fort Bend Community Revitalization Projects was the only qualified respondent.					
Community Revitalization Projects was the only qualified respondent. The program goal is to assist up to 37 households of elderly and/or disabled with incomes below 110% of the Area Median Income (AMI) by providing roof repairs or replacement, and repairs to vital interior systems (plumbing, electrical and heating) to alleviate life, health, or safety hazards. Fort Bend Community Revitalization Projects will evaluate applicants from a HCDD-approved list to assist those who meet the household income standard (below 110% AMI) under the HCDD Minor Critical Emergency Home Repair Program.
