

Preparing for Emergencies in the COVID Environment

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WHY an Emergency Operations Center (EOC) activates

- When a no-notice incident with cascading impacts occurs, such as a a hazardous materials release.
- When there is a warning period before an emergency, such as a forecasted hurricane or flash flooding.
- In preparation for planned events.



Emergency Kits for Employees

Encourage your employees to have grab-and-go emergency kits at the office, in the event of a disaster during the work day:



Include a small first aid kit, cash, energy bars, bottle of water, phone charger, etc.

Business Preparedness



Make an evacuation plan and exercise it regularly



Know how you'll notify your employees, customers, and stakeholders of an emergency



Have redundancy for key resources like power, equipment, and supplies



Create a Business Continuity Plan to become operational again quickly Important Records

- Insurance policies
- Contracts
- Employee Records
- Redundancies
 - Back up hard drives to cloud
 - Inventory of equipment with serial numbers

Emergency Supplies

- Waterproof lockbox
- 3-day supply of good
- Batteries
