


ONE SAFE HOUSTON: ABOUT

Mayor Sylvester Turner announced the "One Safe Houston" program, a \$44 million investment aimed at crime reduction. One Safe Houston is a comprehensive violence reduction initiatives that links research-based strategies to improve public safety and reduce the harms caused by violent crime.





Catalytic Converter **Ordinance**

The ordinance will stop businessto-business reselling of stolen exhaust emission control devices and make it necessary for anyone in possession of a cut catalytic converter to show proof of ownership.

Camera Ordinance

- Under the ordinance, bars, nightclubs, sexually oriented businesses, convenience stores and game rooms must have camera outside.
- Video must be stored for 30 days, HPD gets access within 72 hours of request.
- •Effective 90 days from April 20, 2022

HPARD Additional Urban Park Rangers

- The City will hire fifteen (15) additional Park Ranger positions to support the efforts of local Law enforcement to help keep our parks safe.
- Undergoing the hiring of selected candidates.

HHD Community Re-entry Network Program

- The Community Re-Entry Network Program (CRNP) has a proven track record of providing wraparound support to ex-offenders and their families.
- Re-entry expansion from 500 to 750 participants.





DECREASE IN HOMICIDE RATE

As of June 1, 2022, there was an unofficial number of 189 homicides in Houston compared to 192 homicides at this time last year, representing a 2% decline in the city's homicide rate.

HPD showed a decrease in all 4 major violent crime categories. The reported number of robberies are down about 14%, while reported rapes have decreased by 33% and aggravated assaults have lowered by more than 9%.


The percentage in homicide rates will fluctuate as we make progress in reducing crime. However, we are trending in the right direction.



GUN BUYBACK CIVILIAN OVERVIEW

Station 1

Entry

- Initial drive up through the parking lot
- Firearm will be placed in the trunk
- HPD will remove firearm(s) and ammunition from vehicle; render the firearm(s) safe via a bullet trap.

Station 2

Docking Area

- HPD will receive the firearm(s) and ammo and determine the value of firearms
- resident to redeem for gift card(s)

Station 3

Gift Cards

- Exchange receipt for the gift card along with a "Thank You" letter to citizens.
- HPD will maintain a log with receipts.
- When transaction is completed, the citizen will be directed to safety exit onto the street.
