





2020 Hot Funding in Houston






*HOT dedicated to the arts is separate and apart from MOCA's other major arts funding category, the CIP Civic Art Program.

2020 Arts Impacts

\$94.7M in lost income was reported by 574 applicants through MOCA CARES 1 Relief Grants administered by Houston Arts Alliance.

\$70.9M in lost income was reported by the 900 applicants to MOCA CARES 2 Relief Grants administered by Mid-America Arts Alliance.

Nationally, Americans for the Arts reports that artists have experienced a 79% amount decrease in work that generated income.



2020 HOT Grantee Service Adaptation

2021 HOT Grants Plan

MOCA's 214 <u>2020 grantees</u> recommended by HAA represent the most diverse cohort of grantees in the City's funding history.

Because of reduced HOT funding and reduced staffing within grantee groups, HAA will streamline its 2021 application process by

- allocating up to 63% of funds to the 2020 grantee pool
- allocating at least 37% of funds to an open competitive application process

The strategy balances the diversity gains of the 2020 grantee pool with opportunities for new applications.

MAYORS CALL FOR FEDERAL RESPONSE TO US ARTS CRISIS

The mayors of ten major US cities have penned a letter to the Biden-Harris administration asking it to take an integrated federal approach to supporting the arts. In their missive, the mayors noted that the September unemployment rate for those in the arts ranged from roughly three to six times that of the overall national unemployment rate of 8.5 percent, according to the National Endowment of the Arts.






MOCA CARES 1 Distributions via Houston Arts Alliance

The above chart represents individual CARES Relief grants by Council District.




The above chart represents organizations which are CARES Relief grants by Council District.


MOCA CARES 1 Distributions to Individuals

Micro-Businesses (Individuals)

\$499,800 Was Distributed To 226 Micro-Businesses



The majority of our applicant pool reported that 90% - 100% of their income is derived from their artistic practice. These funds are critical to the artists' ability to sustain their work and livelihoods during the pandemic. Many have become fully unemployed and/or delayed in returning to work due to the loss of gigs, commissions, exhibitions, etc.




Houston's artists and creative represent a wide range of artistic expression in the arts and cultural sector. Artists/Creatives are among the most severely affected workers by the COVID-19 crisis.

Those efforts have ensured that these very important relief resources are reaching a diversity of arts and cultural creatives.


HAA's internal equity improvements will continue to continue to expand the diversity of its clientele in line with the diversity of the City of Houston.




The Texas Music Office (TMO) reports

MOCA hosted a Community Workshop with TMO at the end of October and a clear point from a post survey was that 63% of participants see Houston as a Music Friendly City.






MOCA CARES 2 Funding Distribution 342 Grants Total





Total Grant Distribution Per City Council District







MOCA CARES 2 Funding by Genre







MOCA CARES 2 Distribution Demographics

MOCA CARES Relief Grants Total

A total of \$5M was distributed to 691 recipients over 4 months.

Recipients:

226 artists,

308 musicians,

36 music venues,

and 121 arts and cultural organizations.
