


Riverside Terrace subdivision

- Notable for significance in Houston's story and home to notable Jewish and African-American families past and present such as: Weingarten, Finger, Sakowitz, Schlumberger, and Battlestein, and Rev. William Lawson, Mrs. Mattie Hilliard, Dr. Rupert O. Roett, Dr. Catherine Roett-Reid, Dr. Andrew Allen and famed poet Vivian Ayers (parents of Debbie Allen and Phylicia Rashad), Dr. Edith Irby Jones, TX State Senator and U.S. Rep. Barbara Jordan, TX State Rep. Shawn Theiry, Forest Miles, TX State Rep. Garnet Coleman, architect John Chase Jr., U.S Rep. Sheila Jackson Lee, and Mathew Knowles (father of Beyoncé)
- French, Tudor, Colonial, Mediterranean, Eclectic Revival style homes
- Proposed historic district includes a small part of the first section of Riverside Terrace platted in 1924

Proposed Historic District Boundary




Sanborn Map from 1925- 1949




