Coalition for the Homeless of Houston / Harris County Strategic Homeless Planning Services Agenda Item: II.a.

Background:

The Housing and Community Development Department (HCD) recommends Council approval of an Ordinance authorizing a First Amendment to the Contract for Strategic Homeless Planning Services between the City of Houston (City) and the Coalition for the Homeless of Houston/Harris County (Coalition) to extend the term of the Contract; and provide up to an additional \$130,000.00 in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds for strategic homeless planning services.

As the Lead Agency for The Way Home, Coalition is the sole-source provider for data collection and analysis on homeless response system trends that guide the development, advocacy, and coordination of community strategies to prevent and effectively end homelessness. Their collaboration with homeless services providers, affordable housing providers, medical care facilities, community stakeholders, those with lived experience, non-profits and for-profit businesses allows for greater alignment in every aspect of planning and decision-making necessary for providing critical homeless services and responding to emerging issues in the homeless response system.

The Coalition has received funding through the city for various grants since 2005. The initial Agreement term was from April 1, 2024, to March 31, 2025, but services did not start until June 1, 2024, after council approval. The term was administratively extended to May 31, 2025. This First Amendment will extend the current Agreement term by an additional 12 months to end on May 31, 2026.

No Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) was performed as the agency is a sole-source provider being the designated Lead Agency. There were no findings in the most recent annual compliance monitoring review. As of January 2025, Coalition has utilized 55.83% of their funds.

HCD25-33 SEARCH Homeless Services Agenda Item: II.b.

Background:

The Housing and Community Development Department (HCD) recommends Council approval of an Ordinance authorizing a First Amendment to the Subrecipient Agreement between the City of Houston (City) and SEARCH Homeless Services, providing up to an additional \$1,111,687.00 in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), Homeless Housing and Services Funds (HHSP), and TIRZ Affordable Housing Funds for a program that will serve a total of approximately 770 individuals. Services will include housing case management, navigation services, and Engagement Center services.

SEARCH's provides interventions, assessments, and referrals to services for homeless individuals living on the streets. The Engagement Center is a day shelter and serves as a point of entry for a continuum of services that facilitates introduction toward stabilized employment, housing, and self-sufficiency. The Housing Case Management Program provides long-term housing and supportive services to formerly homeless individuals and families to assist them in achieving housing stability.

HCD conducted a Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) for Public Services funding in December 2022. SEARCH was selected with the option to renew for up to one-year at the City's discretion.

The initial Agreement period was from February 1, 2024 – January 31, 2025, and was administratively extended to April 30, 2025. This First Amendment Agreement term will provide funding through January 31, 2026. SEARCH Homeless Services has received funding from the City of Houston since 1996. There were no findings or concerns in the most recent compliance monitoring. As of January 2025, SEARCH met 144% of their goal and utilized approximately 97% of their total funding.

HCD25-50 SEARCH Homeless Services – ESG-RUSH Rapid Re-Housing Agenda Item: II.c.

Background:

The Housing and Community Development Department (HCD) recommends Council approval of an Ordinance authorizing an Initial Subrecipient Agreement between the City of Houston (City) and SEARCH Homeless Services (SEARCH), providing up to \$925,000.00 in Emergency Solutions Grant – Rapid Unsheltered Survivor Housing (ESG-RUSH) funds, for a program providing rapid re-housing case management and rental assistance to 40 households.

ESG-RUSH funding is a special ESG grant administered by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for areas that are identified as eligible for Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Individual Assistance when a "major disaster" is declared under the Stafford Act to address the needs of individuals and families who are experiencing homelessness or at-risk of homelessness in a declared disaster area and have unmet needs. HUD awarded the City ESG-RUSH funding in response to FEMA DR-4781-TX Texas Severe Storms, Straight-line Winds, Tornadoes, and Flooding and FEMA DR-4798-TX Texas Hurricane Beryl.

SEARCH will quickly move people impacted by the recent disasters who are experiencing homelessness in the Downtown Houston area into permanent housing by providing rental assistance and housing-stability case management services.

In March 2025, in partnership with Harris County and the Coalition for the Homeless of Houston/Harris County, the City invited organizations to submit proposals under a Request for Expression of Interest (REI). SEARCH Homeless Services was one of the agencies that responded and was selected from the applicants that proposed rapid re-housing activities.

This Agreement will provide funding for approximately 12 months, from the date of Countersignature to April 30, 2026. SEARCH Homeless Services has received funding from the City of Houston since 1996.
