

OBJECTIVES



- Improve stages as management framework
- Clarify criteria for stages
- Establish measurable goals for reductions within each Stage
 - Decrease system peaking due to irrigation restrictions
 - Establish rationing to reduce use across all customer types
- Clarify steps to declare, progress and rescind stages
- Clarify violations, enforcement and affirmative defenses

RESPONSES TO PUBLIC INPUT



CHANGES TO PROPOSED ORDINANCE

- Outdoor Uses
 - Allowance of hand watering
 - Earlier evening start time
 - Progression from twice to once weekly restricted watering
 - Specific inclusion of foundation watering
 - Seasonal flexibility for restrictions
- Confirmed applicability to City Departments by stage
- Confirmed voluntary measures in Stage 1 become mandatory in Stage 2
- Clarified context for force majeure declaration
- Lengthened non-residential usage baseline
- Added affirmative defenses for
 - Emergency Response
 - Multi-Family compliance with rationing

RESPONSES TO PUBLIC INPUT



ISSUE ADDRESSED BY PROPOSED ORDINANCE

- Balancing demands with restricted outdoor uses
- Use of reclaimed water (AC condensate, rainwater, etc.)
- Equitability concern of rationing for large families
- Customer consumption awareness during stage 4
- Adequacy of watering periods for low volume irrigation systems
- Fairness in restrictions for areas served through wholesale contracts



RESPONSES TO PUBLIC INPUT



CONSIDERED BUT NOT PROPOSED

- Later morning end time for outdoor restrictions
- Foundation watering at Stage 3 and 4
- Exceptions for new plantings
- Allowance for make-up water for pools

Summary of Improvements

- Consistency of definitions
- Progressive response stages
- Established priority for reduction in use
 - Outdoor Use is first (non-essential)
 - Indoor/production uses not impacted until Stage 4
- Updated enforcement provisions
- Better provides for contract customer measures
