LOW VOLTAGE REQUIREMENTS

As per Motion 2021-0658 in Houston Ordinance No. 2021-1037, the Code Development Committee will work with all interested stakeholders to review the National Electrical Code (NEC) "Low Voltage" permitting requirements.

Houston Public Works believes it will benefit both Building Code Enforcement and the Low Voltage stakeholders to incorporate the low voltage discussions into the overall 2021 Code Development.

This change will ensure all aspects of the 2021 Code Development cycle are conducted together in an open, transparent process.

CODE DEVELOPMENT MEETINGS

 meetings will be held virtually or hybrid format in order to accommodate all potential participants including City officials, stakeholders, and third-party consultants

- the engagement process will define avenues for stakeholder input
- schedules will be developed for various codes and code sections so proposed amendments to each section can be considered comprehensively



STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT

- stakeholder contact list comprised of professionals from all areas & aspects of construction & building codes
 - including Super Neighbor Alliance and stakeholder information as forwarded by the City Council
 - organizations such as Construction Industry Council, Greater Houston Builders Association, etc.
 - electrical contractors, Power Over Ethernet industry professionals, etc.
- code development information and meetings schedule will be posted on the websites, social media, and bulletin boards maintained by the City, Houston Public Works, and Houston Permitting Center
- e-newsletter updates, eblasts, and email notices will be transmitted to stakeholders that subscribe to participate in the Code Development process



GOVERNMENTAL CONSENSUS PROCESS

The City of Houston Code Development Committee mirrors the International Code Council's process for developing construction and public safety codes.

This governmental consensus process provides final determination of proposed code provisions in the hands of active City of Houston employees serving as public safety subject matter experts.
