





GENERAL PROJECT INFORMATION

Q: What is the purpose of this project?

A: The purpose of this project is to install local collector sewer (ranging in size from 8-inch to 18-inch) on Bering Drive, divert sanitary flows with 30-inch to 48-inch gravity sewer on San Felipe Drive and Fountain View Drive and decommission two Lift Stations.

Q: What is going to be replaced/installed in this project?

A: The scope of this project provides the following: Construction of diversion gravity sanitary sewers and manholes within right-of-way. Restoration of pavement and sidewalk. Abandonment of sanitary sewer, including the demolition of Bering and San Felipe Lift Stations.

SIDEWALK, TREES + LIGHTING

Q: Will there be impacts to the sidewalk?

A: There will be minimal impact to the sidewalk

Q: What trees are being removed?

A: Trees to be removed are identified on the Tree Preservation Plan. Diseased or dying trees will be removed. Six trees will be removed in this project. The City of Houston has identified trees that can be preserved during construction on a case-by-case basis.

Q: How long is this project going to take to complete?

A: Approximately 22 months (675 calendar days). Work is scheduled to begin work to begin in mid-January 2021 and anticipated to be completed in Fall 2022. The project schedule depends upon weather conditions.

Q: What are the construction work days?

A: The contractor will work Monday-Saturday from 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM. However, extenuating circumstances may require limited work to take place on Sundays.

Q: Why have various markers and protective barriers been placed around trees, etc.?

A: Both the City of Houston and the contractor are taking precaution to protect existing trees and property as best as they can. Additional right-of-way markers may be placed along the curb and sidewalk/driveway area, and removal of these causes added delays and expense. Please do not remove these markers or any protective precautions that have been provided to the adjacent property.

Q: Will there be Street Light Poles installed?

A: No.



Harper Brothers Construction will be the contractor performing the work with the supervision of Capital Projects and will provide a tentative phasing schedule for the work. They will be making the necessary provisions to accommodate both vehicular and pedestrian traffic during construction.

CONSTRUCTION

Q: Will updates be provided to area residents?

A: Homeowners Association and local business owners are invited to attend the monthly contractor status meetings that will allow them to provide periodic updates to the community.

Q: At some point, will I have issues accessing my driveway?

A: Individual driveways may be impacted for several days during the construction process. Once construction begins on a street the Contractor will give notice 72 hours in advance if they need to work on a specific driveway.

Q: Will this project cause traffic/mobility issues (lane closures, increase of trucks in the area, etc.)?

A: This is trenchless construction. May need one lane closure at shaft locations. Attached are the traffic control plans.

Q: At some point, will my utilities be affected?

: No.

Q: Are they going to dig up the front area or just the street?

A: Both. While protecting existing trees, the project will involve removing and replacing limited portions of pavement and sidewalk. No work is planned on individual (private) property.

Q: What is being done to verify underground work is properly connected as there are concerns about drainage?

A: The City's inspection team ensures the project is built to the design standards and meets all City codes and requirements.
