Mini Murals

The Traffic Signal Control Cabinet Art Program brings public art to neighborhoods. Over 170 Mini Murals have been installed in the city and 4 new Mini Murals are coming to each pilot Complete Community area. Working with UP Art Studios, residents will tell us about their community and help select locations for custom murals.



Civic Art

The Civic Art Program is one of many tools the City uses to invest in the cultural development of the community. The Civic Art Program includes mosaics, sculptures, paintings, photographs and more. A NEW Civic Art project will be commissioned in each Complete Community and developed in consultation with area residents.



Visit My Neighborhood

Lead organizations located in each Complete Community are partnering with Houston Arts Alliance to expand arts and cultural experiences for residents and visitors based on the knowledge and expertise of the community-based organizations. An art writer fellowship will document the program to showcase the arts, cultural and heritage resources and activities in each community.



R.A.P. – Resident Artists Program *FUNDED BY THE NEA

R.A.P. is a pilot program pairing artist Phillip Pyle, II with the City's Office of Veterans Affairs. Over a 16-week period residents in the Third Ward will have the opportunity to engage with the artist. Incorporating an artist to present creative solutions, work with residents and complete an art project is responsive to the City's Cultural Plan.



Poet Laureate Program Workshops

Determined to Excel in Everything Promised, Houston Poet Laureate Deborah "D.E.E.P" Mouton is an internationally-known artist who takes poetry from the page to the stage. Residents will have a special opportunity to engage with D.E.E.P. during a 4-week series workshop celebrating women in the challenges they face, the struggles they overcome and the impact they make at the Smith Library in 2018.



Neighborhood Poetry Project

As part of her city-wide performance poetry project—Emerge Houston, Poet Laureate Deborah Mouton is working alongside 48 area poets to tell stories of their neighborhoods by creating original poems. Twelve compilation videos featuring the poems will be produced and shared for promotion. Residents in each Complete Community will help select a poet from their community for the project.
