City of Houston, Texas, Ordinance No. 2021 - 766

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE FISCAL AFFAIRS OF LELAND WOODS REDEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY ON BEHALF OF REINVESTMENT ZONE NUMBER TWENTY-TWO, CITY OF HOUSTON, TEXAS (LELAND WOODS ZONE); APPROVING THE FISCAL YEAR 2022 OPERATING BUDGET FOR THE AUTHORITY ON BEHALF OF THE ZONE; CONTAINING FINDINGS AND OTHER PROVISIONS RELATED TO THE FOREGOING SUBJECT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

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WHEREAS, the City of Houston (the "City") created Reinvestment Zone Number Twenty-Two, City of Houston, Texas (the "Zone" or "Leland Woods Zone") by Ordinance No. 2003-1330 on December 23, 2003; and

WHEREAS, the Leland Woods Redevelopment Authority (the "Authority"), a local government corporation acting on behalf of the City in connection with the Zone, has submitted an Operating Budget for Fiscal Year 2022 (the "Operating Budget") to the City for approval pursuant to that certain agreement among the City, the Authority, and the Zone approved by Ordinance No. 2007-1293 on November 14, 2007; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to approve the Operating Budget for the Authority; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HOUSTON, TEXAS:

Section 1. That the findings contained in the preamble of this Ordinance are determined to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as part of this Ordinance.

Section 2. That the City Council takes cognizance of the fact that in order to implement the Project Plan and Reinvestment Zone Financing Plan for the Zone, and to make adjustments occasioned by events transpiring during the year, the Authority, upon the approval of the City's Chief Development Officer, may transfer funds from one line item of Project Costs shown on Exhibit "A" to another. Unless approved by the City Council, the Authority may transfer funds only (1) as needed for Debt Service; and (2) from one line item of Project Costs to another, provided that the aggregate of such

transfers does not exceed the lesser of \$400,000 or 5% of Project Costs during Fiscal Year 2022. Subject to the foregoing, the Operating Budget attached hereto as Exhibit "A" is hereby approved for the Authority.

Section 3. That not later than March 31, 2022, the Zone shall, in cooperation with City representatives: (1) identify surplus funds in the Zone's Fiscal Year 2022 Operating Budget based on the difference between Zone revenues and the Fiscal Year 2022 Operating Budget approved by the City; and (2) make available any surplus Zone funds, through appropriate agreement, for projects identified by the City that are eligible for tax increment funding, such as affordable housing, areas of public assembly, incremental costs of municipal services attributable to development and redevelopment in the Zone, and capital projects that benefit the City and the Zone. The agreement may provide for the payment of surplus funds into one or more accounts established by the City or may provide for direct payment by the Zone for that purpose. The Zone shall consider amendments to the Zone Project Plan and Reinvestment Zone Financing Plan that may be necessary to accomplish this purpose, and shall expedite any such amendments.

Section 4. That the approval of this Operating Budget is contingent upon receipt by the City's Chief Development Officer of a document signed by the Administrator of the Zone disclosing the name of each owner or developer of property within the Zone from which the Administrator has received compensation during the last five calendar years, and the amount of compensation by owner by year. Compensation may be expressed by category as follows:

Category I

Less than \$1,000.00

Category II

At least \$1,000.00 but less than \$10,000.00

Category III At least \$10,000.00 but less than \$50,000.00
Category IV At least \$50,000.00 but less than \$100,000.00
Category V At least \$100,000.00 but less than \$500,000.00
Category VI At least \$500,000.00 but less than \$1,000,000.00
Category VII \$1,000,000.00 or more

Section 5. That there exists a public emergency requiring that this Ordinance be passed finally on the date of its introduction as requested in writing by the Mayor; therefore, this Ordinance shall be passed finally on such date and shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; however, in the event that the Mayor fails to sign this Ordinance within five days after its passage and adoption, it shall take effect in accordance with Article VI, Section 6, Houston City Charter.
